Their missision was to arm, feed and clothe the troops from Phu Bai to the DMZ. After this tour, he was sent to Da Nang and discharged in June 1969 at the rank of Seargant after serving five years in the USMC.

Using the GI Bill, Gerry attend Robert Morris College and obtained a business degree. He raised through the ranks at Mellon Bank to become the CEO at three community banks and retired in 2013.

Gerry and wife, Mary (McCrea), were married in 1973 and have two children and three grandaughters. Gerry has been a member of the Three Rivers MCL since 2003 and currently is the league's Chaplain.
